

Practical Incident Handling Test

The 'Practical Incident Handling Test' is a practical job-related test based on the genuine job needs of a Police Constable. It serves to assess, amongst other things, the candidates' communication ability in both Chinese and English languages, judgment and fact-finding ability. Candidates will be required to watch two videos relating to a police-related incident in a group setting during the Group Interview. They will be allowed to view each video twice and to jot notes. The 'Practical Incident Handling Test' will be divided into two parts as follows:

1. Part I: Stimulated Fact-finding Ability Assessment – Candidates will be given 20 minutes to record an account of the incident as related by the victim or witness in Chinese.
2. Part II: Stimulated Report Recording Assessment – Candidates will be given 10 minutes to record a simple report in English that the informant used, containing basic particulars such as date, time, location, description of the relevant persons or property items, etc.
