

Bear in mind

The tips below to dodge all traps

Law enforcers **will not** ask for “guarantee money”, banking passwords and verification codes

Beware of deepfake and verify the identities of your family and friends carefully

Do not dial numbers given in unknown SMS or rashly click on embedded links

Stay alert to investment schemes with high returns

Call **18222** if you suspect that you've been scammed

Trap No. 1

Pretend customer service

1 Impersonation Scammers may call, claiming to be from banks, insurers, or telecommunication providers

2 Scaring you [AB Bank] Thank you for signing the service contract. Autopay of \$78,000 has been enabled, enquiry number: 800963282

[CD Insurance] Thank you for your payment for renewing your policy. Click on <http://cdcd.cd.pl> to cancel the service

3 Submission of information Scammers may ask for your banking passwords or trick you into screen sharing to steal your money.

Phishing SMS

Trap No. 2

Investment scams

1 Pretend to be close friends I have insider investment tips

Scammers will add you as friends randomly on social media platforms, or send random messages to start a conversation

2 Install fraudulent App Install this investment App now

The investment records are fake, designed to trick you into thinking you're profiting

3 Scam you out of your money Scammers urge you to invest more, but you'll never get your money back

Trap No. 3

Pretending officials

1 Scammers impersonate law enforcers via calls with pre-recorded messages or in person

Bogus Public Security Bureau Officers

2 Claiming to be investigating cases Scammers name you as suspects and ask you to facilitate investigation

3 Forcing you to transfer money Trick you into giving banking information or transferring money to “prove innocence”

4 Moves to ward off scammers

1. Be sharp-witted!

Public Security Bureau officers
will never call you

2. Don't trust them!

Even if strangers are able to recite your
background information, they may not be
genuine law enforcers

3. Stay alert!

Sender IDs of SMS with no “#”s
and phone numbers prefixed by “+852”

4. Hang up!

Hang up immediately if you
receive unknown calls
