≛港輔助警察隊(輔警)共有約 **香** 3 200人,成員來自各行各業, 可説是臥虎藏龍。現年40餘歲的楊偉 國,今年三月底輔警出更,雖份屬新 兵,但本業上早已成就非凡,皆因其 正職為香港大學李嘉誠醫學院臨床醫 學學院矯形及創傷外科學系教授。

楊偉國透露,他早於大學時期已 有意投身警務工作,惟其後因各種原 因未有嘗試。事隔20多年後,他去年 以舍監身分協助輔警隊到港大進行招 募,當時在太太和輔警長官的鼓勵 下,決定自己也參與投考,冀一圓當

在成功投考後,必須接受合共 370小時的基本訓練,才能成為輔警 警員。對於經常要到海外公幹的楊偉 國而言,本來難以抽空參加訓練,惟 剛巧當時香港在疫情影響下尚未與外 通關,變相為他的輔警之路開綠燈。

由教授變為學員,楊偉國努力向 上的精神絲毫不減。以射擊為例,他 的成績本已不俗,但仍深感自己可有 進步空間,遂持續向教官及表現更佳 的同學請教,逐步提升準繩度。最終

他以全班第一的優秀成績畢業,榮獲 銀笛獎。

楊偉國結業後獲派駐中區警區軍 裝巡邏小隊,第二日出更已成功拘捕 疑犯。當晚他巡經威靈頓街與德己立 街交界,接報有的士遭刑事毀壞及司 機被毆打,同一時間目睹一名年約30 歲的男子向他迎面跑來。身為醫學院 教授的楊偉國,瞬間已瞥見男子雙手 有割損的痕跡,迅速推斷他與的士刑 事毀壞案有關。經過截查盤問,該男 子承認涉案,楊偉國立即作出拘捕, 整個過程至今仍歷歷在目。「當天落 更後,我的心情久久未能平復,清晨 回到家,更興奮得立即拍醒太太,與 她分享學以致用的執法經歷。」

雖然擔任輔警的日子尚短,但楊 偉國已經感受甚深。他認為以輔警身 分執勤時,儼如經歷第二人生。在處 理不同案件期間,能夠接觸到社會各 個階層,又可擴闊視野,實在難能可 貴。因此, 他呼籲有志服務社會的市 民,積極考慮加入輔警行列,為協助 正規警務人員守護香港踏出重要一

中國與東盟周邊國家警校論壇

香港警察學院(學院)獲邀於六月十五日出席公安部、雲南與柬埔寨合辦的第四屆中國與東盟等周邊國家警察院校長論壇暨執法能力建設圓桌會議。會議以「互幫互助 合作共贏——後疫情時代執法能力建設與邊境安全治理合作」為主題,並以實體及線上形式進行。

行動部高級警司方志堅就「後疫情時代邊境安全治理」作線上演說,分享香港警隊在維護邊境安全的四大執法方針:透過建立全面的情報交流及溝通機制、深化多邊多角度的聯合執法行動、善用科技提升警政效能、重啟國際和國內培訓調研。

超過100位來自中國、柬埔寨、汶萊、印度、老撾、緬甸、越南、泰國、尼泊爾、菲律賓和斯里蘭卡的代表參與會議。瀾滄江—湄公河綜合執法安全合作中心的代表亦有出席。

人員赴新加坡參加研討會

商業罪案調查科警司李慕賢及財富情報 及調查科總督察鄭思為於七月六日及七日前 赴新加坡,參加由新加坡銀行協會主辦的金 融犯罪研討會。兩人分別在專題分享環節, 講解以公私營及跨國合作模式打擊騙案的經 驗,以及針對利用空殼公司清洗黑錢的調查 技巧。 研討會吸引500多名來自亞太及歐美的金融監管機構、執法部門及銀行業界的代表參與,亦邀得財務行動特別組織主席T. Raja Kumar作主題演講。研討會提供良好的溝通平台,讓參加者交流打擊金融犯罪的經驗及當中遇到的挑戰和困難,亦促進警隊與海外單位的聯繫。



注 島總區聯同康樂及文化事務署於七月十九日 在香港大會堂舉行代號「紫焰」的跨部門聯合反恐演習。演習模擬數名恐怖分子闖入正進行 大型慶祝活動的香港大會堂發動恐怖襲擊,人員 迅速抵達現場採取行動,即時作出戰術介入,成 功制服所有恐怖分子及拯救市民,並安全有序地 疏散所有在場人士,化解危機。

是次演習有超過200名人員參加,包括港島總區行動部、衝鋒隊、警察機動部隊、反恐特勤隊及中區警區正規和輔警人員,而警隊學長計劃的學員亦有參與。演習更邀得來港交流的新加坡志願特警的部門首長和代表團成員,以及灣仔區撲滅罪行委員會主席楊嘉成及一眾成員到場觀察,並參觀新式的流動指揮站,讓他們深入了解警隊的反恐工作和危機處理。

標準刑事調查課程自二〇一六年獲香港學術及職業資歷評審局認證後,所 有畢業學員均可獲取專業證書,人員若在刑事單位工作時完成「在職學習」階 段,更可獲簽發警務(刑事調查)高等文憑,持有高等文憑的人員於報讀指定 更高學歷的課程時可獲學分減免。截至二〇二三年五月,共3 997名人員完成 標準刑事調查課程並獲發專業證書,當中約九成人員在刑事單位展開「在職學 習」,其中241名督察、278名警長和866名警員已獲簽發高等文憑。

為推廣課程和協助同袍,警察學院偵緝訓練中心及考評中心推出多種措 施,如定期舉辦工作坊、與進行「在職學習」階段的刑偵人員及其督導人員會 面以提供協助、並將學習歷程檔案上載至警隊內聯網以便利人員取用。






Promotional tram tour for ADCC 6th Anniversary

Anti-Deception Coordination Centre 反 詐 騙 協 調 中 心 The Anti-Deception Coordination Centre (ADCC) organised a tram tour on July 20 to celebrate its 6th anniversary. Commissioner Siu Chak-yee, joined by representatives of 16 public and private organisations that have been working closely with the Force to disseminate anti-deception messages, officiated at the kick-off ceremony. The officiating guests later boarded the tram to travel from Sheung Wan to Causeway Bay. Adorned with the latest anti-deception promotional messages, the tram broadcast anti-deception songs and information on the way. The guests, along with more than 40 SILVERSHIELD ambassadors, distributed anti-deception leaflets and souvenirs to the public in Causeway Bay to raise the public's anti-deception awareness.

ADCC was set up in 2017 under the Commercial Crime Bureau (CCB), with a view to consolidating all relevant efforts of the Force and stakeholders in fighting and preventing crime. Since its establishment, ADCC has received over 160 000 calls from the public, prevented 2 000 on-going deception cases and intercepted defrauded money as high as \$11.8 billion. Up to May 31, 2023, ADCC has mounted 632 operations and arrested 661 persons, involving at least 614 deception cases.

To better facilitate people from different sectors in the community assisting the Force to circulate anti-deception messages, CCB has launched Project SILVERSHIELD since June this year. SILVERSHIELD ambassadors are recruited and trained in collaboration with various government departments, public and private organisations. Anti-deception events are held to spread anti-deception messages, such as "scams are rampant, tell everyone".

To step up anti-deception publicity, ADCC will introduce a series of major anti-deception promotional campaigns from late July to August. YLDIST kick-starts typhoon precaution



Schools in KE invited to CT workshop

Kowloon East (KE), Inter-departmental Counter Terrorism Unit (ICTU), Police Negotiation Cadre (PNC) and Education Bureau coorganised a workshop at KE Regional Headquarters on June 27. A total of 173 principals, teachers and social workers from 48 secondary schools and 28 primary schools in KE attended the event.

ICTU briefed on information about national security and community safety, and introduced the approach of "run, hide, report" and the concept of "spot and report" for school staff to keep youngsters safe in the face of violent incidents or terrorist attacks. PNC shared the basic skills for crisis negotiation, strategies in dealing with student suicides on campus and relevant cases explaining how schools and the

Force could collaborate. The participants then exchanged their views in group discussion. At last, they were arranged to visit the Report Room of Ngau Tau Kok Police Station. Emergency Unit and Traffic of KE showcased police equipment and weapons to enhance the visitors' understanding of police work.

Deputy Regional Commander of KE Mark Anstiss stated that the growth of children and young people was vital to Hong Kong's development. The Force spared no effort in joining hands with the schools and parents to help children grow healthily. He hoped that the workshop could help school staff understand how to deal with crises and raise their awareness so that they would learn how to save themselves and protect the people around them.

Standard Criminal Investigation Course concludes

he Detective Training Centre of Hong Kong Police College (HKPC) held the graduation ceremony of Standard Criminal Investigation Course (SCIC) and Advanced Diploma conferment ceremony on June 23. A total of 101 trainees received their Professional Certificate and 46 Force members completed the Workplace Learning (WPL) phase and were issued an Advanced Diploma. Director of National Security Kong Hok-lai attended the ceremony as the quest of honour

Since accreditation by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications in 2016, all graduates are awarded a Professional Certificate. Officers who have further completed the WPL phase in their respective crime unit will be awarded an Advanced Diploma in Policing (Criminal Investigation). Holders of Advanced Diploma are entitled to credit exemptions when enrolling in designated advanced academic courses. Up till May 2023, a total of 3 997 officers have completed SCIC with Professional Certificate awarded. Approximately 90 per cent of them have commenced WPL in the crime units. Amongst them, 241 inspectors, 278 sergeants and 866 police constables have been awarded Advanced Diploma.

The workshop provided a platform for experience sharing to enhance the officers' communication skills with vulnerable witnesses so that they could handle cases more professionally, thereby safeguarding the welfare and rights of children during the investigation and prosecution process. To enhance the Force's professional capability in dealing with cases involving abuse of children and mentally incapacitated persons, Crime Wing established VSC in July 2022. Up till June this year, VSC has recruited more than 190 trained members, with over 1 700 video-recorded statements taken.

CSTCB joins tripartite exchange to curb cyber crime

Senior Superintendent of Cyber Security information at source. and Technology Crime Bureau (CSTCB) Lam Cheuk-ho, on behalf of the Force, attended the tripartite exchange seminar on "Developments and Challenges of Emerging Cyber Crime" held at the Academy of Public Security Forces in Macao on July 4. The seminar brought together scholars and experts on policing from the Mainland, Hong Kong and Macao. Secretary for Security of Macao Mr Wong Sio-chak officiated at the opening ceremony of the seminar. During the seminar, the speakers scrutinised the trend and threats of emerging cyber crime. Issues in various realms, such as artificial intelligence, deep fake, underground industries and cyberattack, were discussed in depth, with a series of strategies to combat and prevent the crimes suggested

Seminar on Macao gaming industry

To enhance officers' knowledge about the gaming industry in Macao and its related crimes, the Organized Crime and Triad Bureau (OCTB) held a seminar at the Police Headquarters on July 10. The Head of Gamingrelated Crimes Division of Macao Judiciary Police (MJP) Mr Tang Kam-va was invited to lead a delegation to Hong Kong to participate in the seminar with officers from Crime Bureaux, frontline detectives and forensic accountants to share the latest development in the gaming industry in Macao. With the implementation of the new legislation in

Macao, the relevant authorities have strengthened regulations and measures in different aspects especially targeting junket operator, illegal money lending in casinos, loansharking related illegal debt collection activities, and money laundering, etc.

Officers from the Financial Intelligence and Investigation Bureau and OCTB also shared with more than 300 frontline detectives on the investigation of money laundering cases related to the Macao gaming industry and referral mechanism with MJP to strengthen frontline officers' capability and confidence in handling related cases





Genius among HKAPF recruits

The Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force (HKAPF) comprises 3 200 members from all walks of life, with many unsung geniuses and talents yet to be discovered. In his 40s, Kelvin joined the HKAPF in late March this year. Although he just started to walk the beat, he has already walked a long way in his own field - Kelvin is a professor in the Department of Orthopaedics and Traumatology of the School of Clinical Medicine at the Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine of the University of Hong Kong (HKU Med).

Joining the Force has always been on Kelvin's bucket list since he was an undergraduate. For various reasons, however, he made other pursuits over the last two decades. Last year, as a dormitory warden at HKU, he assisted HKAPF to recruit new members on campus. With the encouragement of his wife and HKAPF officers on the spot, Kelvin decided to make application himself, with the hope to realise his dream

His successful application meant that he had to receive the 370-hour foundation training before becoming an HKAPF officer. Under normal circumstances, it is difficult for Kelvin to take part in the training as he is always abroad on business. But under the influence of the epidemic back then, outbound travels were suspended. This had in fact cleared the obstacle on his way to join HKAPF

Despite the change in his role from a professor to a recruit, Kelvin's spirit of striving for better outcome never diminishes. Take shooting as an example. He felt there was much room for improvement even though his grades were sufficiently good. So he kept seeking advice from instructors and fellow classmates who had better performance. The accuracy of his shooting was further improved. At last, he graduated with the best grades in his class and won the Silver Whistle Award.

Kelvin was assigned to the Patrol Sub-unit of the Central District after passing-out. He already succeeded in making an arrest while on beat for the second day. When he was patrolling at the junction of Wellington Street and D'Aguilar Street that evening, there came a report that a taxi was criminally damaged and the driver was beaten. At that very moment, he saw a man about 30 years old running towards him. Being a HKU Med professor, Kelvin instantly spotted the wounds on the man's hands, and deduced promptly that the man was related to the taxi vandalism case. After interrogation, the man admitted that he had been involved in the case, and Kelvin made the arrest immediately. The entire process is still vivid in his mind. "I couldn't calm myself down for a long time after going off beat that day. I was so excited that no sooner had I arrived home early in the morning than I woke my wife up and shared with her my experience in applying what I had learned in law enforcement."

Although his days as an HKAPF officer are still short, Kelvin already feels deeply about his duty. He feels like experiencing a second life when he is on beat as an HKAPF officer. He can get in touch with all walks of life across the social strata and broaden his horizon, which is a truly invaluable experience. Therefore, he appeals to members of the public who aspire to serve the community to join HKAPF, taking an important step in assisting regular police officers to safeguard Hong Kong.
