水警總區創料比賽取佳績



政府資訊科技總監辦公室轄下的智慧政府創新實驗室於三月十五日舉辦人工智能創新應用創科比賽頒獎典禮。水警總區支援科憑藉智能光電感應器及攝像機搜索系統方案,從22支隊伍所提交的71份建議書中脱穎而出,獲頒優異獎。

水警總區的方案利用人工智能和影像分析等技術,協助控制和協調網絡攝像機搜索海面,並實時分析影像,以偵測海上 遇險人士,提高海上搜救的成功率。

反詐騙協調中心 獲新加坡傑出社區合作獎

商業罪案調查科轄下的反詐騙協調中心 (協調中心)於二月十九日獲得新加坡警察部 隊頒發傑出社區合作獎,以表彰協調中心在預 防和制止詐騙的承諾和貢獻。此次獲獎肯定協 調中心在打擊詐騙方面的決心及致力加強國際 協作的努力。

協調中心自二零一七年成立以來,積極與新加坡警察部隊的商業事務局反詐騙中心合作 打擊詐騙相關罪案,包括設立相互止付機 制。在二零一七年七月至二零二四年二月期 間,兩地共處理659宗止付個案,攔截約 2億8 600萬港元的騙款。

跨專業研討會

一 事支援科於三月二十一日舉辦保護兒童免受網絡性罪行威脅的跨專業研討會,吸引超過500名警務人員、家長、校長、教師、社工和兒童服務工作者於線上線下參與。是次研討會為各個領域的專業人士提供交流平台,提高他們保護兒童免受網絡性罪行威脅的意識和應對能力,並促進不同專業之間的合作。

處長蕭澤頤在致辭時表示,近年兒童被網友色 情勒索、詐騙,甚至性侵的案件越來越多。要有效 幫助兒童預防和打擊網絡性威脅,需要各界齊心合 力,以跨專業的方法解決問題。

來自各領域的十名專家代表出席研討會,包括 育兒專家陳美齡博士、兒科教授葉柏強和醫生曾雯 清、校長黃定康、香港青年協會社工朱香雄以及教 育局、社會福利署、律政司、警察心理服務課、網 絡安全及科技罪案調查科的代表。他們從多角度探 討如何更有效地保護兒童免受網絡性罪行的威脅。 有參與校長表示,在研討會的得着能應用於學校的 日常管理中;亦有參與社工指出,研討會能加深參 與者對兒童網絡安全問題的認識。

全城守網2024 各方攜手護網安

網絡安全及科技罪案調查科(網罪科)的「全城守網 2024」 網絡安全運動於三月繼續與各界持份者合作,透過不同渠道、線上 線下活動推動全民數碼素養和防騙意識。

「防騙視伏APP」全城短訊

網罪科聯同反詐騙協調中心與香港主要流動電訊商合作,於三 月中旬向全港流動電話用戶發出推廣「防騙視伏APP」的短訊,宣 傳升級版的三大功能,並呼籲公眾安裝或更新程式。

|全方位教育

網罪科於三月與本地中學、耆樂警訊、香港鐵路有限公司、中國銀行(香港)、數碼港和香港生產力促進局等團體合作,舉辦多個講座和攤位,向超過2 000名來自不同年齡層和界別的人士傳遞網絡安全及防罪資訊。網罪科總警司林焯豪在資訊安全企業的周年網安活動致辭時表示,網絡罪案數字不斷攀升,網絡威脅需要公私營機構共同應對。

與國際刑警合作

網罪科在三月二十日以線上方式出席第13屆國際刑警反跨境經濟罪行工作小組會議,討論尖端技術所引致的網絡詐騙威脅。網罪科署理高級警司陳純青在會上就議題提供分析及應對措施。是次會議有120多名各地的執法人員參與。

正太區首個第五輪相互評核。非估人員培訓課程

東大富情報及調查科於三月四日至八日 在警察學院舉辦亞太區首個第五輪 相互評核評估人員培訓課程。課程為期 五日,由財務行動特別組織(特別組織)、亞洲/太平洋反清洗黑錢組織(亞 太反洗錢組織)及國際貨幣基金組織的導 師講授。

財經事務及庫務局副秘書長陳詠雯主 持課程啟動禮。課程吸引32名海外代表及 11名來自警隊、財經事務及庫務局、香港 金融管理局、證券及期貨事務監察委員會及 其他相關政府部門的人員參與。

學員需要在課程期間為虛構國家進行評核,包括檢討其打擊洗錢及恐怖分子資金籌集的法例和規例、進行模擬面談、擬備相互評核報告及向全體成員匯報,以獲取評估人員的資格。

相互評核是一項同儕審查程序,由來自 特別組織/亞太反洗錢組織成員的法律、財經 和執法專家組成評估小組,定期評核另一成員 的打擊洗錢及恐怖分子資金籌集措施。在每個 相互評核周期,各成員均會受評一次。第五輪 相互評核為六年周期,香港的相互評核則訂於 二零二九年至二零三零年進行。

傑出銀行員工嘉許典禮

商業罪案調查科於三月二十二日舉辦傑出銀行員工嘉許典禮,表揚及感謝在防止及打擊騙案方面與警隊緊密合作、表現卓越的銀行和員工。處長蕭澤頤、副處長(行動)周一鳴、刑事及保安處處長葉雲龍、助理處長(刑事)鍾詠敏、金管局助理總裁朱立翹及銀行公會防制洗錢委員會主席李慧文擔任主禮嘉賓。

今屆獲嘉許的銀行員工人數高達287人,於過去一年半協助 警隊識別及勸阻364宗騙案。獲嘉許的前線職員數目較上屆的 192人大幅上升五成。此外,典禮亦設有六個傑出企業獎項,以 表揚在不同範疇積極協助警隊防止及打擊騙案的銀行。

處長蕭澤頤致辭時表示,期望持續深化警隊與銀行業界的合作,共同制定更具策略性、主動及創新的措施打擊騙案。

- 零二二年度保安服務最佳培訓獎

防止罪案科及職業訓練局(職訓局) 合辦的二零二二年度保安服務最佳培訓獎 頒獎典禮於一月十二日舉行。典禮由行動 處處長陳東、職訓局保安及紀律服務訓練 委員會主席葉振南及保安及護衞業管理委 員會副主席陳浩華博士主禮,各總區及保 安業界代表亦有出席。

今年共向保安公司頒發136個獎項,包括68個金獎、34個銀獎、21個銅獎及13個優異獎。評判團由警隊、職訓局轄下的保安及紀律服務訓練委員會及保安及護

衞業管理委員會的代表組成。評核範圍包括參與公司對保安從業員的培訓及所提供 的培訓資料、培訓資源的投入、管理層對 培訓計劃的參與和支持程度等。

行動處處長致辭時讚揚得獎公司積極 發展持續培訓計劃,並鼓勵業界設立長期 和優質的培訓計劃。他分享警隊與保安從 業員攜手滅罪的成功個案,藉此感謝表現 出色的保安從業員。保安業界歡迎警隊及 職訓局的支持,並表示會繼續提高業界訓 練水平。





要基礎設施保安協調中心(協調中心)於三月十二日在警察總部舉行主題為「守護我城 • 共建未來」的保安研討會,吸引超過250名公私營重要基礎設施的持份者參與。

是次研討會旨在加強業界的反恐意識及應對內部威脅的挑戰,推廣供應鏈安全及網絡系統安全,並鼓勵業界制定標準作業程序、應變計劃及復原方案等,以全面提升其人員、系統及設施的保安水平及韌性,確保業務即使受到不同程度的干擾仍得以維持運作,並將關鍵業務受阻的時間及影響減至最低。

來自保安局、網絡安全及科技罪 案調查科、跨部門反恐專責組、重大 事故科及協調中心的講者分享反恐及 保安事宜。香港科技大學工學院院長 羅康錦教授亦擔任主講嘉賓,分析本 港交通運輸網絡的應變能力。此外, 爆炸品處理課及反恐特勤隊在場展出 裝備,與業界互動。

為進一步提升非華裔社群的反恐意識,反恐專責組亦以法語及六種少數族裔語言(印尼語、尼泊爾語、烏爾都語、旁遮普語、他加祿語和印地語)印製反恐宣傳單張,於體驗館及其他社區活動中派發。

查 隊於四月十三日在警察學院(學院)舉行全民國家安全教育日暨香港警隊180周年開放 日,提高全民的國家安全意識,加強培養國民身分認同,讓市民更加了解維護國家安全的重要性,同時加強警隊與市民的溝通。

活動邀得中央人民政府駐香港特別行政區聯絡辦公室(中聯辦)主任鄭雁雄、行政長官李家超及處長蕭澤頤致辭,並與一眾嘉賓主持啟動儀式。處長蕭澤頤致歡迎辭時提及總體國家安全觀,表示警隊將繼續肩負重任,堅守維護國家安全的防線。

當日以大匯演展開序幕,除了音樂表演外,還有駕駛表演、警犬表演及由特別任務連、反恐特勤隊及穿越機參與的反恐演練。緊接其後是「紀念香港警隊成立180周年時間囊封存典禮」,警隊管理層將具紀念價值的物品封存,並計劃在20年後再次開啟,與市民共同見證歷史時刻。

開放日分為四大主題,包括「國安守城」、「跨越180」、「警伴同趣」及「專業新警界」。現場設有國安資料展覽、警隊歷史時光長廊、特別部門的精鋭裝備、現役警察車輛展示及各單位的互動遊戲,加深市民對警隊的認識。

he National Security Education Day cum Hong security. Kong Police Force (HKPF) 180th Anniversary -Police College (the College) Open Day was held at the College on April 13 to enhance public awareness of national security and strengthen the development of national identity for the public to understand the importance of safeguarding national security, as well as further enhancing communication between the Force and the public.

Upon invitation, Director of the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR (LOCPG) Mr Zheng Yanxiong, Chief Executive Mr John Lee and Commissioner Siu Chak-yee delivered speeches at the session and officiated at the opening ceremony with other honourable guests. In his speech, the Commissioner mentioned the holistic approach to national security. First Joint Assessor Training for Asia-Pacific Region for fifth round of ME

The Financial Intelligence and Investigation Bureau (FIIB) hosted the first Joint Assessor Training for the Asia-Pacific Region for the fifth round of Mutual Evaluation (ME) at the Police College between March 4 and 8. The training was delivered by trainers from the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), the Asia/Pacific Group on Money Laundering (APG) and the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Deputy Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury Ms Chan Wing-man officiated at the launching ceremony of the course that brought together 32 overseas representatives and 11 local participants from the Force, Financial Services and Treasury Bureau, Hong Kong Monetary Authority, Securities and Futures Commission and other relevant government departments.

The trainees had to work through the evaluation of a fictional country, which included reviewing its legislation and regulations in anti-money



laundering (AML) and counter-financing of terrorism (CFT), conducting mock interviews, preparing an ME report and giving a presentation to the plenary, in order to attain qualification as assessors.

ME is a peer review process in which FATF/APG member jurisdictions

form an evaluation team composed of legal, financial and law enforcement experts to assess regularly the AML/CFT measures of another member jurisdiction. The fifth round of ME is a six-year cycle. Hong Kong's ME is scheduled to take place between 2029 and 2030.

Training in Beijing

National Study Programme for Training Staff of Disciplinary Forces

Senior Superintendent Tsang Chiu-tong led four officers of the School of Foundation Training, Police College, together with 20 representatives from six other disciplinary forces forming a 25-person delegation, to attend the National Study Programme for Training Staff of Disciplinary Forces at Peking University between December 13 and 23, 2023. The programme featured a series of lectures delivered by mainland experts and scholars, covering "Xi Jinping Thought on



Socialism with Chinese Characteristics in a New Era" and the political system of the country. In addition, the delegates visited the Beijing Police College and the People's Public Security University of China. They also toured the National Museum of China, the Museum of the Communist Party of China and several historical monuments to deepen their understanding about the history, situation and development of the motherland.

Study programme at PPSUC

'Let's T.A.L.K.' multi-disciplinary seminar

The Crime Support Group held the multi-disciplinary seminar on Child Sexual Abuse in the Cyber World on March 21, attracting over 500 police officers, parents, principals, teachers, social workers and child service workers online and offline. The seminar provided a platform for professionals from various fields to exchange ideas, aiming to raise their awareness and ability in responding to the threat of online child sexual abuse, as well as promoting collaboration among different professions.

Commissioner Siu Chak-yee expressed in his speech that there had been more cases of children being sexually blackmailed, defrauded, and even sexually assaulted in recent years. To effectively help children prevent and combat online sexual threats, all sectors of society needed to work together and solve problems with a multi-disciplinary approach.

The seminar brought together ten experts from various fields, including parenting expert Dr Agnes Meiling Kaneko Chan, pediatricians Prof Ip Pak-keung and Dr Tsang Man-ching, school principal Mr Wong Ting-hong, and social worker of the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups Mr Chu Heung-hung. Representatives from the Education Bureau, Social Welfare Department, Department of Justice, Psychological Services Group, and Cyber Security and Technology Crime Bureau also participated in the seminar and conducted in-depth discussions on how to more effectively protect children from the threat of online sexual crimes from different perspectives. A participating principal said

that the insights he gained from the seminar could be applied to daily management of schools. A participating social worker commended the seminar for deepening participants' understanding of online safety issues for children.

Acting Senior Superintendent of CSTCB Chan Shun-ching presented an analysis and provided some countermeasures Over 120 law enforcement officers from around the world attended the meeting.



Third Conort of L.O.N. sustains youth's momentum against drugs

Institute on Narcotics (L.I.O.N.) kicked off with the ice-breaking day cum opening ceremony at the Police Headquarters on April 6. Commissioner Siu Chak-vee officiated at the ceremony and presented certificates of appreciation to sponsoring bodies and certificates of appointment to L.I.O.N.'s Executive Committee members, professional trainers and mentors for their dedication to anti-drug efforts.

The Commissioner advised the mentees to appreciate the learning journey in the year ahead to become leaders. On the day, the mentees and mentors went through team tasks that required problem-solving and selfchallenging skills. To cheer mentees of the third cohort, awardees from the second cohort came to share their learning results and insights from their exchange tour to New Zealand.

The third cohort of L.I.O.N. commenced on February 24 with the first training activity - a visit to Shek Kwu Chau Treatment and Rehabilitation Centre. The mentees assisted in renovating the facilities

he third cohort of the Leadership of the centre and listened to former drug addicts' stories of drug abuse and journey of addiction treatment. The mentees deeply understood the slogan, "Drugs? Never Ever!" after the activity. The first training day was held at Hong Kong Polytechnic University on March 9. The mentees acquired drug-related knowledge and criminal liabilities from professionals and explored drug identification methods through lab visits. During the new stress management course introduced this year, the mentees learned how to deal with pressure, with guidance from professional social workers.

> With the experience gained in the past two cohorts, L.I.O.N. will keep optimising the programme of the third cohort to give the mentees more learning experience. Founded in 2021, L.I.O.N. nurtures 80 secondary school students and 20 undergraduates to become anti-drug leaders each year and has established an effective platform for concerted anti-drug efforts in the community. In the first two cohorts, 200 young anti-drug leaders were trained to disseminate anti-drug information to over 50 000 citizens.

Constables Tsui Man-hei, Cheng Tunshing, Leung Tsz-kin, lu Wing-hong and Chow Siu-fai of PLN 4 EU NTS, who were already attending to the suicide attempt case at Tsing Tsuen Bridge. They succeeded in confirming that the identity of

the man attempting suicide was the to give up the suicide attempt. informant's husband. Under the command of Senior Inspector Cheng Chun-kit and Station Sergeant Chan Kwok-chung of PLN 4 EU NTS, officers communicated with the man patiently and convinced him

The informant wrote a compliment letter afterwards to praise the officers for their caring, prompt operation and decisive professionalism in handling the incident,



Force signs MoU with Insurance Authority

he Force entered into a Gregoire. ACP CRM said that the signing of MoU was a milestone that could enhance the regulatory agency's supervision on the insurance industry and resilience of the regulatory framework. Mr Gregoire said that the signing of MoU marked the establishment of closer co-operation between the two sides. ►MAR's award-winning electro-optical sensors

MAR excels in innovation competition

The Smart Government Innovation Lab of the Office of the Government Chief Information Officer organised the award presentation ceremony for the "Innovative Application with AI" Innovation Competition on March 15. The Intelligent Electro-optical Sensors and Cameras Search System submitted by Support Bureau of Marine (MAR) excelled among 71 proposals from 22 teams and attained a Merit Award.

MAR's system makes use of AI, image analysis and other technologies to assist in controlling and co-ordinating network cameras to search the surface of the sea and perform real-time analysis of captured images to detect individuals in distress, thereby enhancing the effectiveness of maritime search and rescue operations.

ADCC presented with Singapore's award

The Anti-Deception Coordination Centre (ADCC) under the Commercial Crime Bureau was presented with the Outstanding Community Partnership Award by the Singapore Police Force (SPF) on February 19 to recognise ADCC's commitment and contribution towards preventing and deterring scams. This award affirmed ADCC's determination against scams and efforts in upholding international collaborations in the fight against scams.

Since its establishment in 2017, ADCC has been actively working with the Anti-Scam Centre of the Commercial Affairs

Department within SPF to combat deception-related crimes, including the establishment of a reciprocal stop-payment mechanism. Between July 2017 and February 2024, a total of 659 stop-payment requests were handled between the two places, with a total of HK\$286 million crime proceeds withheld.





New journey after 40 years of service

Firearms instructor turns into hairdresser

Yu Kang-por is a 59-year-old retired Sergeant who has served in the Force for over four decades. After completing the Post-Retirement Service Contract, Por continues to serve the Force in a new capacity as a hairdresser from November 2023 onward. He is now the "Police Station Hairdresser" at the Tsuen Wan Police Station Barber Shop to provide hairdressing services to police officers and their family members.

Por has been interested in hairdressing since his childhood. He often observed hairdressers working in their salons, so he mastered some basic skills. However, he did not choose to become a hairdressing apprentice. Instead, he joined the then Hong Kong Police Cadet School after finishing Form 3. During his 30-year service as a firearms instructor at Police College before his retirement, Por taught recruit police constables (RPCs) shooting skills. Por revealed, his hairdressing skills were polished while he taught. It happened that RPCs were required to have short hair during their training, so Por volunteered to cut hair for them when he was off duty. Practice makes perfect. Por gradually upgraded his hairdressing skills.

Upon recommendation of a colleague in 2011, Por started giving free haircuts to the elderly in a nursing home. Although it was volunteer work, Por needed to undergo assessment. Faced with 15 elderly people, including some with special health conditions who needed to get their hair cut while lying down, Por successfully passed the test. He always bears in mind the message from the head of the nursing home: "The elderly may not be able to tell whether a haircut is good or not, but they can tell whether you cut it for them wholeheartedly or otherwise." Since then, Por and other volunteers have been extending their free haircut service to other underprivileged groups. Under guidance of

senior hairstylists in the volunteer team, Por's hairdressing skills have become more comprehensive, laying a solid foundation for him to become a "Police Station Hairdresser" after his retirement.

Many souvenirs of the Force and retirement gifts are displayed in Por's barber shop at the police station. Among them, the two discontinued antique razors given by his friends are Por's favourite. Por jokes that he is one of the rare hairdressers with police experience in Hong Kong. Whether they want to cut hair or chat about their policing work, all police officers are welcome.
