本月初上任的處長周一鳴為警隊定出三 大工作重點,分別為維護國家安全、推 動智慧警政及鞏固團隊文化。

▲年來,香港社會整體保持穩定,治安情況持續向 **近** 年來,曾尼亞昌王區內另一個 好。本月初上任的處長周一鳴,對中央政府及香港 特區政府給予香港警隊的支持、以及社會各界的共同努 力,深表謝意。

他強調,社會的穩定絕對得來不易,除了警隊所有 同事盡忠職守,竭誠服務市民,更重要是警民同心同 行,一起守護香港這個家。

處長又特別感謝前處長蕭澤頤,在過去數年帶領警 隊跨過重重挑戰,為香港治安及警隊發展作出卓越貢 獻。未來,他會秉承歷任處長的專業精神,承先啟後, 帶領警隊提升專業能力,令香港繼續成為全世界最安全 及穩定的城市之一。

處長表示,已為警隊定出三大工作重點,包括維護 國家安全,加強全民的國安意識;推動智慧警政,善用 科技提升工作效能,為市民提供更優質的服務;以及鞏 固團隊文化,深化人員的警隊核心價值觀和歸屬感,促 進警隊新舊成員的傳承。

國安風險仍在 提升全民意識

「香港社會現時看似平靜,但其實暗湧處處,並非完 全沒有國安風險,有些人還是蠢蠢欲動,藉不同機會作

出煽動行為,因此警隊有責任保障 和維護國家安全。」處長提醒,全 體警務人員不論身處什麼崗位,都 必須居安思危,嚴密防範一切潛在 的國安風險。同時,他鋭意加強國 安宣傳教育工作,提升全民的國安 意識,希望市民大眾認識到,國安 概念不僅是一條法例,更是關乎國

家的整體安全,涵蓋20個重點領域。

推動智慧警政 務求事半功倍

推動智慧警政是另一個工作重點。處長認為,世界 瞬息萬變,科技發展一日千里,警隊必須與時並進,透 過推動智慧警政,積極善用科技,提升人員的行動效 率、執法和工作效能,為市民提供更優質的服務。同 時,他亦希望應用科技優化內部運作,精簡工序,以達 至事半功倍之效。

深化核心價值 促進世代傳承

處長指出,警隊其中一個核心價值是團隊精神,他 會繼續鞏固這項優良文化,從而深化人員的核心價值觀 及歸屬感,管理層會為人員提供更到位的支援和發展機 會,同時深入了解年輕同事的想法,促進不同世代警務 人員的傳承,凝聚警隊力量。

他深信,每位同事都會為能夠成為一名警察而感到 自豪,並引以為傲。「大家在警察學院畢業時,操過 『桂河橋』的那一刻,心中的使命感都會倍加強烈,信 念只有一個,就是決心成為一名除暴安良的警察,與身 邊的同袍一起儆惡懲奸。從前如此、現在如此,將來也

必定如此。」

他承諾未來會貫徹以人為本的 管理理念,盡力支援同事的不同需 要,「我衷心希望各位同事懷着敢 想敢做、精益求精的態度,展現 『One Force』的團結力量,不 論遇上任何挑戰,大家都無分彼 此、上下一心,好好守護香港。」



































管理人員發展課程 全國兩會精神分享會2025

查★ 察學院於四月八日舉辦「全國兩會精神分享會 2025」的管理人員發展課程講座,邀請港區全國政協委員曾偉雄及劉業成擔任主講嘉賓。處長周一鳴親臨支持,與逾百名警司或以上職級的正規人員、輔警及文職人員一同出席。

曾偉雄率先講解二零二五年第14屆全國人民代表大會第三次會議和中國人民政治協商會議第14屆全國委員會第三次會議(全國兩會)的重點內容。他指出,今年「十四五規劃」進入最後階段,亦是「十五五規劃」啟動之年。政府工作報告提出多項與國家安全、社會穩定及對外開放有關的政策方針,強調全面貫徹「一國兩制」方針,香港應在深化改革與對外合作中擔當更積極角色,並善用國家發展優勢推動本地繁榮穩定。

劉業成隨後從政治體制與發展戰略角度出發, 講解中國共產黨第20次全國代表大會以來的發展路 向,並重點闡釋全國兩會所釋出的「中國式現代 化」理念。他指出,香港應緊貼國家發展節奏, 「追時間、追成績」,進一步強化三大支柱產業, 包括金融、貿易及專業服務,同時積極參與高水平 對外開放,發揮作為國際樞紐的獨特優勢。

講座內容亦涵蓋政府工作報告中提出的14項國家安全重點範疇,與警隊日常執法工作有密切關係。兩位嘉賓強調,警隊在維護社會穩定、支援高質量發展方面肩負重要角色,應主動配合國家政策方向,加強治理能力及專業化水平。

最後,兩位嘉賓與人員互動交流,討論「一國兩制」下



的香港定位、以及如何配合國家發展戰略實現治理現代化, 讓人員對全國兩會精神有更深入和全面的認識。

交通總部舉辦 的士車隊制度簡介會

為使前線人員深入了解的士車隊制度 的執行細節,交通總部邀請運輸署代表於 二月二十日向過百名人員介紹的士車隊的 運作、特點及前線人員可能面對的情境。 運輸署於去年七月向五個的士車隊營 辦商發出有條件暫准通知,同時為車隊的士引入新規定及全新車隊的士 停車處。所有車隊的士均須展示車隊的士證明書及車隊的士識別牌。首 支的士車隊已於三月三十一日試運。 領的科技罪案警政顧問小組(顧問小組) 於二零二二年十二月成立,旨在就最新資 訊科技發展對社會構成的挑戰提供策略建 議。警隊於今年三月十四日委任13名專 家組成第二屆顧問小組,成員來自網絡安 全、人工智能、區塊鏈、金融科技、數碼 基建、低空經濟等多個領域。

葉雲龍表示,顧問小組是連接業界

與警隊的重要橋樑,透過專業合作推動 多項防罪措施,包括強化通訊網絡安 全、促進銀行數據共享以打擊洗黑錢活 動等。他期望新一屆顧問小組能引入更 多行業創新理念,協助警隊應對新質生 產力帶來的執法挑戰。同日亦舉行首次 會議。顧問小組成員在會上積極分享其 專業領域的重點議題,並訂定未來討論 的框架及策略方向。

少年警訊(少訊)主辦,中國銀行(香港)全力支持的「少訊創新科技大賽2024-25」於四月十二日在香港科學園舉行頒獎典禮暨嘉年華,頒發70個獎項予110名得獎者。處長周一鳴、教育局副局長施俊輝博士、中國銀行(香港)資訊科技部總經理翁暉及行動處處長陳東擔任主禮嘉賓。

處長致歡迎辭時指,隨着警方加強打擊「太空油毒品」,今屆大賽加入青年抗毒主題,鼓勵參賽者透過創意方案,提高青少年的抗毒意識。他提到,今屆的參賽作品非常出色,證明體驗學習是STEAM(科學、科技、工程、藝術和數學)教育的重要基石。少訊未來將推出更多創新活動,為香港和國家培育創科人才。

今次是少訊連續第四年舉辦創新科技大賽,旨在鼓勵中小學生運用STEAM的知識和技能,構建創新可行的智慧城市方案。今屆增設兩項最佳智慧城市獎,表揚在人工智能和樂齡科技方面最具創意的作品;同時亦設最佳安全城市獎,以鼓勵參賽者在防騙滅罪、青年抗毒及改善社區安全方面提出創新方案。比賽共吸引超過1700名來自近160間學校的學生參加,收到逾1300份作品。得獎名單已上載至少訊網頁。

National Security Education Day cum Police Museum Open Day

To echo the National Security Education Day (NSED) on April 15, the Force held the National Security Education Day cum Police Museum Open Day on April 13 to enhance public awareness of national security, foster their sense of national identity and offer an opportunity for the community to learn more about the history and work of the Force.

The Deputy Financial Secretary Mr Michael Wong was invited to deliver a speech at the opening ceremony and to officiate at the event. Commissioner Chow Yat-ming, in his opening remarks, said that national security was the cornerstone of prosperity and stability for a society. He added that the Force would continue its unwavering efforts to prevent, suppress and impose punishment for acts endangering national security. Stressing that community support and participation were essential elements for safeguarding national security, he hoped the public would remain vigilant at all times and work together to safeguard national security.



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

Tai Po District PSU Team 3

Dear Commissioner of Police,

We are hiking enthusiasts from Guangzhou. We write this letter to express our gratitude towards members of Tai Po District Patrol Sub-Unit (PSU) Team 3, especially Liu Sir, Lee Sir, Yip Sir and Ngan Sir.

On the evening of February 6, we were hiking the MacLehose Trail and reached the end of Section Seven at the Lead Mine Pass campsite around 6pm. We were exhausted due to the complex terrain of the area and inaccessibility of transportation. The night in the mountains grew increasingly cold and we were inadequately clothed and supplied. Facing hunger, cold and the crisis of hypothermia, we had no choice but to call the police for help.

Fortunately, Liu Sir and his team contacted us promptly. Together with the officers from the Fire Services Department, they enabled us to escape danger safely.

This incident allowed us to experience fully the professional efficiency of the Hong Kong Police Force (HKPF) and their care for the public. We extend our highest appreciation to HKPF. Thank you all.



The Netherlands

Senior Superintendent Yuen Ching-fong led an eight-member Police Force (NPF) between March 3 and 7. Rural Functional Training Course

24 officers from New Territories North (NTN), New Territories South, Kowloon East, Hong Kong Island and Police Tactical Unit Headquarters completed the eight-day Rural Functional Training Course at NTN Regional Headquarters and Civil Aid Service (CAS) Headquarters between February 26 and March 7 respectively. Upon completion of the course, the trainees were awarded with the Certificate in Mountain Search and Rescue (SAR) Training under the Qualifications Framework Level 3.

The eight-day course featured two parts, with the first three days of internal training by Quick Reaction Force (QRF) NTN. The trainers, who were certified Mountain Craft Assistant

Coaches, delivered a comprehensive blend of theoretical and practical mountaineering knowledge to the trainees. Subsequently, the trainees received the mountain SAR training arranged by CAS to learn techniques for mountaineering and SAR.

The trainees expressed that the course content had emphasised both theoretical and practical sessions. It enabled trainees to enhance their confidence and professionalism in performing SAR duty and searching for culprits or evidence in the rural area. It also strengthened interdepartmental communication. They would pass along the knowledge acquired to the colleagues to enhance their relevant

organised by the Junior Police Call (JPC) of the Force and fully supported by the Bank of China (Hong Kong) (BOCHK), the JPC Innovation and Technology (I&T) Competition 2024-25 held its Award Presentation Ceremony cum Carnival at the Hong Kong Science Park on April 12. 70 awards were presented to 110 winners. Commissioner Chow Yatming, Under Secretary for Education Dr Sze Chunfai, General Manager of Information Technology Department of BOCHK Mr Yung Fai and Director of Operations Chan Tung officiated at the ceremony.

In his welcome remarks, the Commissioner said that as the Force had stepped up enforcement against "space oil drugs", the competition introduced the theme of youth drug prevention, encouraging participants to raise anti-drug awareness among young people through creative solutions. He also highlighted the quality of entries received, which

underscored the pivotal role of experiential learning in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) education. JPC would launch more innovative activities to nurture I&T talents for Hong Kong and our country.

It was the fourth consecutive year that JPC organised the competition. The competition aimed to encourage primary and secondary school students to utilise their knowledge and skills in STEAM to construct innovative and feasible solutions for Smart City. Two Best Smart City Awards were introduced this year to recognise the most innovative entries in Al and gerontechnology, while the Best Safe City Awards were also presented to acknowledge innovative solutions for fraud prevention and crime fighting, youth drug prevention and community safety enhancement, for ensuring that citizens could continue to thrive in a safe living environment. Over 1 700 students from nearly 160 schools participated, and over 1 300 submissions were received. The list of winning teams has been uploaded onto the JPC

Some winners introduced the creative ideas and stories behind their works at the ceremony. An I&T carnival which featured a workshop on simulated evidence collection at crime scenes and a number of virtual reality games was held for participants to learn about the work of the Force while experiencing the fun of technology.

TBHQ's briefing on taxi fleet regime

or frontline officers to gain a deeper understanding of the operation details of the taxi fleet regime, the Traffic Branch Headquarters (TBHQ) held a briefing for over 100 Force members. Transport Department (TD) representatives were invited to explain the operation of the taxi fleet regime, its features and possible scenarios to be confronted by frontline officers.

TD issued conditional grants of Taxi Fleet Licence to five taxi fleet operators in July last year. New regulations related to taxi fleet and new taxi fleet stopping places were also introduced. All fleet taxis are required to display a fleet taxi certificate and a fleet taxi plate. The first taxi fleet started its pilot operation on March 31.

To encourage non-ethnic Chinese (NEC) youth to join the Force, Project Gemstone of Yau Tsim District (YTDIST) hosted its first-ever Iftar Dinner Gathering cum Inspector Recruitment Talk under the theme of "Setting Sail for Your Inspector Dream" on March 26. In celebration of Ramadan, YTDIST specially prepared halal cuisine for Muslim trainees and trainees from other ethnic groups to enjoy traditional dates and curry together, while also learning about information related to applying for the Force. The event attracted over 20 young people of diverse ethnicities.

Deputy District Commander of YTDIST Chak Wai-kit attended the event and shared his insights in inspectors' leadership role within the Force. He encouraged the attending NEC youths with his own mottos. Detailed explanations were also provided to participants about the qualifications required and the process for applying to become a probationary inspector. A trainee under Project Gemstone, who is an inspector at present, shared his application experience.

Since its establishment in 2013, Project Gemstone has helped 52 NEC youngsters join the disciplinary forces among over 1 000 trainees. To support NEC youth's development sustainably, the project provides them with a Chinese Language class every Saturday and a physical training class every Wednesday.

WTSDIST promotes cyber security to university teachers and students

Wong Tai Sin District (WTSDIST) organised a seminar on cyber security at the Kowloon East (KE) Regional Headquarters on March 21. Nearly 80 teachers and students from a master's degree programme of Lingnan University attended the seminar.

The Police Community Relations Officer of WTSDIST Tso Wing-in started the seminar by giving a briefing on the modus operandi of online scams targeting Mainland students in Hong Kong and then gave some anti-deception tips. Subsequently, Regional Commander (RC) of KE Dr Law Yuet-wing enhanced the participants' capabilities against cybercrime and provided preventive measures through analysing global deception data and scam techniques. In the discussion session, RC KE had in-depth discussion with the teachers and students on the Force's

strategies in combatting cybercrime, the mode of cooperation between Mainland and Hong Kong, and possible contributions from the academia.

The Police Mentorship Programme (PMP) 2023/24 Awards Ceremony was held at the Police Headquarters on March 31, with the attendance of over 100 mentors, mentees, university representatives, project officers and families of awardees. During the winter of 2023 and summer of last year, many students participated in internships in different units of the Force. Their projects covered a wide range of topics, including research, event planning and IT-related work.

The top ten winners this year were selected from the internship reports submitted by over 250 participants. The reports were first evaluated by representatives from mentors of respective chapters with their top three reports put forward, and a panel formed by the Human Resources Branch made the final selection. Mentees having submitted the top three reports were invited to give a presentation at the ceremony to compete for the Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards. The judging panel led by the Head Mentor cum Assistant Commissioner (Personnel)

Chan Man-tak assessed the presentations and determined the top three positions on the spot. In addition, the new Chinese Impromptu Talk Competition was launched this year. It simulated the Extended Interview for probationary inspector candidates, upon which over 100 members of the audience voted on-site to pick their favorite impromptu speaker.

To facilitate members of the public joining the Force, the Recruitment Division (RECDIV) hosted the Community Outreach Recruitment Express (CORE) in Kwun Tong between April 5 and 6. The response to the event was enthusiastic, as

shown by the over 100 applications received on the spot. Commissioner Chow Yat-ming attended the event to engage with applicants and offer encouragement. He emphasised the Force's commitment to recruiting talents and welcomed individuals from all backgrounds to join the Force

Additionally, various police units showcased the diversity and challenges of policing work, allowing the public to gain hands-on insight into different aspects of policing. Management Development Programme Seminar on Spirit of Two Sessions 2025

Police College organised a seminar under the Management Development Programme titled "Spirit of Two Sessions 2025" on April 8. Hong Kong Members of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC) Tsang Wai-hung and Lau Yip-shing were invited as keynote speakers. Commissioner Chow Yat-ming attended the session, alongside over 100 regular and auxiliary officers at the rank of superintendent or above, as well as their civilian equivalents.

Tsang Wai-hung opened the session by outlining the key messages of the third session of the 14th National People's Congress and the third session of the 14th National Committee of the CPPCC (Two Sessions) in 2025. He noted that this year marked the conclusion of the 14th Five-Year Plan and the

commencement of the 15th. The Report on the Work of the Chinese Government (the Report) laid out multiple priorities, including safeguarding national security, maintaining social stability and further opening up to the international community. It also reaffirmed the principle of fully implementing "one country, two systems" and highlighted the



need for Hong Kong to take on a more proactive role in national reform and international cooperation, capitalising on the advantages brought by national development.

Lau Yip-shing followed with an in-depth discussion from the perspectives of the political system and development strategy.

He elaborated on the development direction subsequent to the 20th National Congress of the Communist Party of China, and the concept of Chinese modernisation as presented in the Two Sessions, and emphasised that Hong Kong should stay aligned with the pace of the country's development and "catch up with time, catch

up with result". He encouraged Hong Kong to further strengthen its three pillar industries — finance, trade, and professional services — and actively participate in high-level national initiatives for external engagement, leveraging its unique position as an international hub.

The seminar also covered 14 National Security priorities outlined in the Report, which were closely related to the Force's everyday law enforcement duties. Both speakers emphasised the significant role of the Force in maintaining social stability and supporting high-quality development. Officers should take the initiative to align with national policies, enhance governance capabilities and pursue greater professional excellence.

The session concluded

with views exchanged between the speakers and participants, touching on Hong Kong's position under "one country, two systems" and how policing could support national strategic development and modern governance. The sharing deepened the officers' comprehensive understanding of the spirit of the Two Sessions.

Second term of Cybercrime Policing Advisory Panel

The Cybercrime Policing Advisory Panel led by the then Director of Crime and Security (D C&S) Yip Wan-lung was established in December 2022. The panel aims to provide strategic recommendations on the social challenges emerging from the latest development of technology. The Force appointed 13 professionals to form the second term of the panel on March 14 this year. The panel members come from diverse sectors, including cyber security, AI, blockchain, fintech, digital infrastructure and low-altitude economy.

Yip Wan-lung described the panel as a critical bridge between the Force and the industry. Through professional



collaboration such as enhancing telecom network security and promoting data sharing among banks to combat money laundering, some key crime prevention initiatives were implemented. He hoped that the new term would bring forward industry innovations to assist the Force in coping with the law enforcement challenges brought about by new quality productive forces. During the first meeting held on the same day, the panel members actively shared key topics from their respective areas of expertise and established the framework and strategic direction for future discussions.

ong Kong society remains generally stable in recent years, with the situation of law and order improving continuously. The Commissioner states that three major priorities have been set for the Force, i.e. safeguarding national security and enhancing public awareness of national security; promoting smart policing by leveraging technology to improve operational efficiency and provide





better services to the public; and strengthening team culture by deepening officers' core values and sense of belonging, as well as fostering continuity between current and future members of the Force.

Enhancing public awareness while national security risks remain

"Despite its seeming calmness at present, Hong Kong society is full of undercurrents. It is not entirely free from national security risks indeed. Some individuals remain restless and try to incite others through various means. Therefore, it is the Force's responsibility to safeguard and uphold national security." The Commissioner reminds all Force members that regardless of their position, they should always remain vigilant and be prepared to guard against all potential national security risks. At the same time, he is committed to strengthening national security publicity and education efforts to raise public awareness of national security. He hopes the public do understand that the concept of national security is more than a mere piece of legislation; it is a notion that concerns the overall security of the country in 20 key areas.

Promoting smart policing for doing more with less

Promoting smart policing is another key priority. The Commissioner believes that in a rapidly changing world with advancing technology, the Force must keep pace with the times. By embracing smart policing, the Force can actively leverage technology to enhance operational efficiency, law enforcement and overall effectiveness, thereby providing better services to the public. He also aims to optimise internal operations and streamline processes with the application of technology for achieving the effect of "doing more with less."

Deepening core values to foster intergenerational continuity

The Commissioner points out that teamwork is one of the core values of the Force. He will continue strengthening this culture to deepen officers' core values and sense of

belonging. The Force management will provide them with better support and development opportunities, and will seek to better understand the perspectives of younger colleagues for promoting continuity across generations and uniting the Force's powers.

He firmly believes that every officer takes pride in being a Force member. "At the moment of graduating from the Police College and marching across 'the River Kwai Bridge', everyone feels a stronger sense of mission, with only one belief in mind: to become a police officer who fights crime and upholds justice, standing side by side with their colleagues against criminals. This was true in the past, remains true today, and will always be true in the future."

He pledges to adhere to a people-centric management philosophy and strives to meet the diverse needs of his colleagues. "I sincerely hope that all colleagues will embrace a bold and innovative spirit, striving for excellence and demonstrating the united power of 'One Force'. No matter what challenges we face, we will stand together and stay united to safeguard Hong Kong."
